Section 1 - Short visits to the local area and all Road Safety initiatives.

During your child's time at Hadrian Acadamey short visits are made to the local area to support curricular studies. Examples are visits to Katherine Drive shops and the local streets to study buildings.

School visits lasting half a day or longer, or involving transportation i.e. coach travel, will require an individually signed permission slip.

This consent form will cover all such visits outlined above during your child's time at Hadrian Acadamey.

I should like my child to take part in all such visits as outlined and, whilst I understand that the staff in charge of the visit will take all reasonable care of the pupils, I also understand that the school cannot be held responsible for any loss, damage or injury other than due to negligence.

I give consent for my child to take part in visits to the local area as outlined above.

Section 2 – Photographs for Publicity Events.

Section 4 – Pupil Internet Access

Rules for Responsible Internet use

- I will only use ICT in school for school purposes.
- I will only use my class email address or my own school email address when emailing.
- I will only open email attachments from people I know, or who my teacher has approved.
- I will not tell other people my ICT passwords.
- I will only open/delete my own files.
- I will make sure that all ICT contact with other children and adults is responsible, polite and sensible.
- I will not deliberately look for, save or send anything that could be unpleasant or nasty. If I accidentally find anything like this I will tell my teacher immediately.
- I will not give out my own details such as my name, phone number or home address. I will not arrange to meet someone unless this is part of a school project approved by my teacher and a responsible adult comes with me.
- I will be responsible for my behaviour when using ICT because I know that these rules are to keep me safe
- I will support the school approach to online safety and not deliberately upload or add any images, video, sounds or text that could upset any member of the school community.
- I know that my use of ICT can be checked and that my parent/ carer contacted if a member of school staff is concerned about my eSafety.

Section 5 – Home/School Partnership Agreement

- Let you know about any concerns or problems that are affecting your child and work with you to resolve them.
- Inform you about what the teachers aim to teach your child each term.
- Be open and welcoming at all times and offer opportunities for you to become involved in the life of the school.
